- To have a valid vote you MUST number a minimum of 5 candidates, ideally you should number all candidates. This way you choose where your preferences go.
- Where we have more than 1 candidate standing we ask that you number them 1 through to 5. this will give them primary votes IMPORTANT.

- Lyons vote SFFP 1 Matthew Allen - remaining 4 you choose the order for Carlo Di Falco, Andrew Harvey, Wayne Turale, Shane Broadby.
- Braddon vote SFFP 1 Brett Neal, the remaining three you choose the order for Glen Saltmarsh, Kim Swanson, Brenton Jones with Craig Garland 5.
- Where we only have 1 candidate standing Denison Lorraine Bennett Franklin Brendon Next mark them number 1. How you choose to number the remaining candidates is your choice as we HAVE NOT DONE A DEAL WITH ANY PARTIES.
- What is a Donkey vote?
 - A donkey vote occurs when a voter numbers every box on the ballot paper in order from top to bottom. In some cases, a voter might start at the bottom of the ballot paper and number them in order to the top. A Donkey is a formal vote and will be counted.
- What is an Informal vote?
 - Be blank
 - Not have a number 1
 - Use ticks and crosses instead of numbers
 - Write on the ballot paper words like Donald Duck
 - Identify the voter in some way
 - Not have been initialled by an Australian Electoral Commission worker
 - If you choose to vote informal you have wasted a vote, a privilege not all the people in world have.
